



4. Genetic information has been used for a long time to "match" family members. One major impetus given to this work began in Argentina in the late 1980's and early 1990's to identify children of those who "disappeared" during the military dictatorship of 1975 – 1983. Many of these children were abducted by the military and police, and adopted by senior officials after their real parents had been murdered. The pedigree (below) shows the pedigree for one such child, Liliana Pereya, whose allegedly true parents, Claudio Ernesto Logares and Monica Grinspon, disappeared after arrest. Blood samples from the child and her living relatives in the Grinspon and Logares families were analyzed using VNTR. Only her "mother" agreed to
